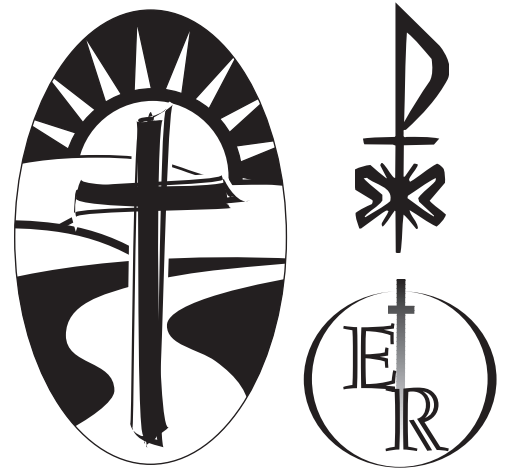

- Samantha organized a group in her church to crochet blankets for nursing home



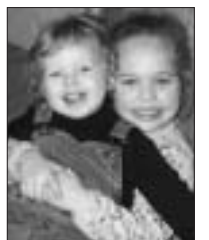
Our Mission

strengthened.

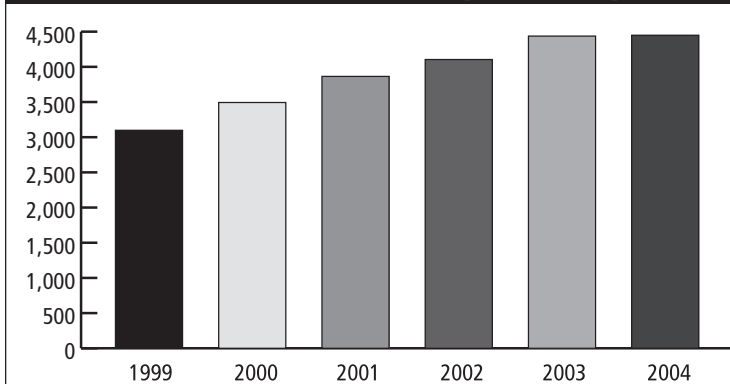

A Legacy of Promise

A CAMPAIGN TO STRENGTHEN CROSS TRAILS MINISTRY

*For the Lord is good and his love endures forever;
His faithfulness continues through all generations.*

Psalm 100:5

Cross Trails Ministry has launched the Legacy of Promise Capital Campaign to strengthen the youth, adult and family ministry of Lutheran Camp Chrysalis and Ebert Ranch Camp.

Our goal is to raise \$1.5 million to meet current and future ministry needs.

These generous donations will provide facilities that:

- Provide simple comfort for all ages, year round
- Are true to the heritage of summer camp
- Are able to meet the needs of adults and families

Primary issues at Lutheran Camp Chrysalis

Twenty percent of Chrysalis' capacity is lost in the non-summer months. Several of the cabins were built in the early 1900's and must be shut down due to lack of insulation and heat. Lack of air conditioning is the most common summer complaint.

People who donate to the Legacy of Promise Campaign will provide funds to:

- Build 3 new cottage-style duplex cabins at Chrysalis to replace 5 older cabins
- Air condition the remaining cabins at Chrysalis



Primary issues at Ebert Ranch Camp

The primary housing is in two single-sex bunkrooms. These are not suitable for family groups or adults who seek some additional privacy. In addition, there is no large meeting room at Ebert that is suitable for non-summer usage. This greatly limits what retreat groups can do with their time at camp.

People who donate to the Legacy of Promise Campaign will provide funds to:

- Build one new cottage-style duplex cabin with a small kitchen, and a large gathering room with a fireplace.
- Cover associated infrastructure improvements

The Campaign

In May 2004, at the corporation meeting of Cross Trails Ministry, representatives of the owner congregations voted to authorize the board and staff to conduct a capital campaign with a \$1.5 million dollar goal.

The money will be raised over a 3 year period through a combination of individual, organizational and congregational donors. This appeal will seek funds in addition to the gifts Cross Trails Ministry needs annually to keep the ministry alive and growing. It will rely on the strong support of congregations and individuals with a heart for this ministry.

Through summer camp and retreats, people of all ages are strengthened in their relationship to Christ, each other, the church and community. And as they are strengthened, they go on to strengthen others.

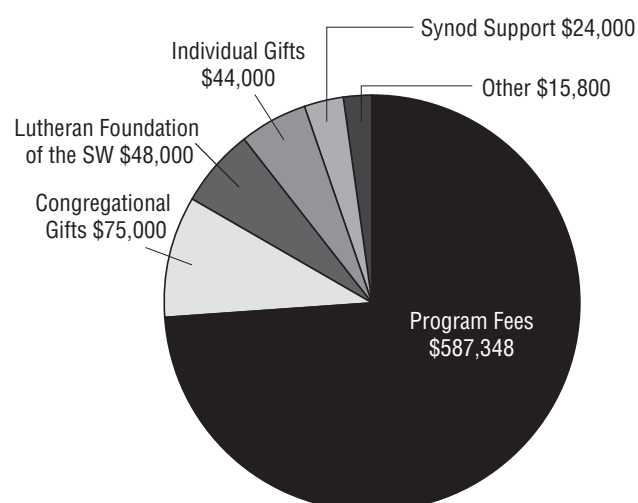

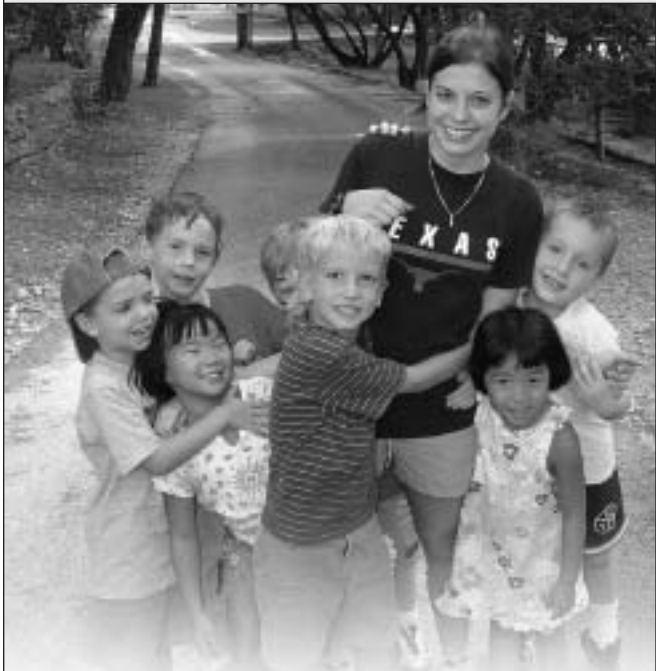
